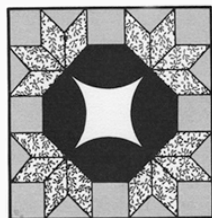

## Play Quilt-O, Enjoy Expanded Show & Tell in August

The August 14 guild meeting is designed as a fun evening, playing a little Quilt-O and sharing all the work of our members in an expanded Show & Tell. You are encouraged to bring your latest projects (finished or in-progress) to share with the group.

To play Quilt-O, bring a dollar for the Quilt-O card (or \$2 for 2 cards or more if you wish). Each time we play a round it will "cost" one fat quarter for each board. The first player with "Quilt-O" gets the fat quarters for that round. If there is more than one winner, the fat quarters will be split. We will play up to four rounds and have ample time for Show & Tell as our primary purpose. Cake, lemonade, coffee and tea will be available for all.
